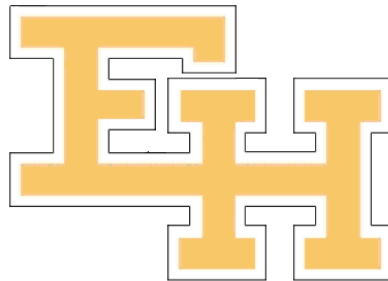

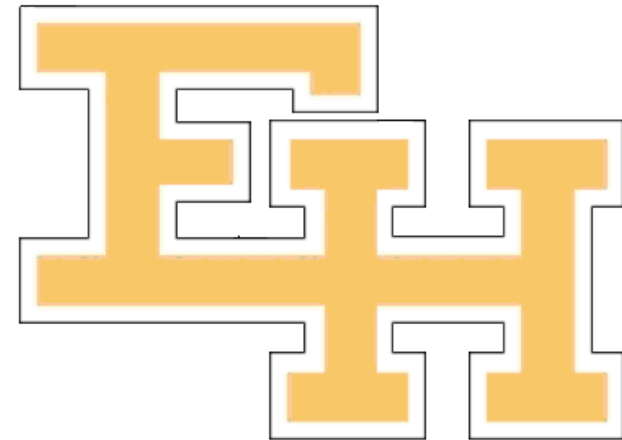

EXPECTATIONS BY CLASS

SENIORS

Seniors are required to complete an Upperclassmen Seminar Registration by February 5th. Each Senior must register with their Guidance Counselor. All parent signatures and phone numbers must be included. Any Senior who does NOT complete the Registration will be ineligible for the Senior PROM.

JUNIORS

UPPERCLASSMEN SEMINARS

Directions: Upperclassmen will be offered multiple opportunities with a variety of topics related to college and career preparation. Juniors and seniors must complete and submit an Upperclassmen Seminar Registration Form in Connections February 5, 2010.

Purpose: Part of the mission, here at East Hartford High School, is to encourage students to “begin the path to success in college and careers,” and the purpose of these seminars is help work towards achieving this goal. By attending these sessions upperclassmen will have the opportunity to explore the different avenues of education available to them when planning for their years after graduation.

Daily plan: Two Seminars will be held each day: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Each day the two sessions are 90 minutes long.

Session One: 7:30-9:00
Session Two: 9:10-10:40.
