### Sample Works Cited Page

Works Cited ← Title (no bold, underline or italics)

DeMont, John. "Reclaiming a Hard Past." Maclean's, 14 Feb. 2000: 26.

← Article titles enclosed in "quotation marks"

← All entries alphabetized (by author's *last name* or title of article)
