



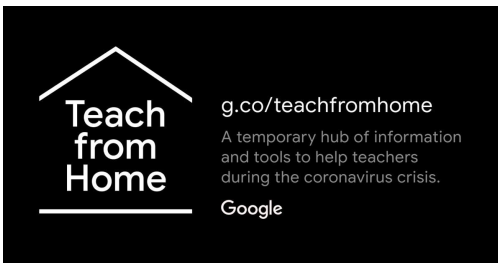
## Google Classroom Guide For Teachers

## A Parent Communication Tool for Teachers



Google Voice provides teachers with a usable phone number that is linked directly to your Google Account. It allows you to create a local number that can be dialed through your computer as a way of communicating with families. The settings allow you to hold “office hours” for availability by allowing you to limit when you “take calls.” It will interface with smartphones or your computer and provides transcripts of voicemails and a call log of who you called and when.
