Support Learning and Engagement While at Home

<u>Boardmaker</u>: Free downloadable materials to support communication and the development of activities related to a variety of topics.

<u>Math Aids</u>: Resources that allow parents and educators to make an unlimited number of printable math worksheets that can be customized to each student and grade level.

<u>Bookshare</u>: People with dyslexia, blindness, cerebral palsy, and other reading barriers can access online digital books that are customized to meet learning style and need. Electronic books are available in audio, audio + highlighted text, braille, large font, and other formats using most devices including smartphones, tablets, Chromebooks, computers, and assistive technology devices.

<u>ReadWorks</u>: Reading comprehension support and instruction for English learners, special education students, and struggling readers, as well as remote learning resources and tools.

<u>Tips for Families in Supporting Their Children with Disabilities in Virtual Formats</u>: Suggestions to create a comfortable and distraction-free learning space and schedule to promote distance learning and social engagement.
